**BUYING ONLINE – WATCH OUT FOR PHONEY WEBSITES – USE A “WHO IS” SEARCH**

Fraudsters have set up high specification websites advertising electrical goods and domestic appliances, which appear to be great value but do not exist. The fraudsters will request your card details via their website; however you will then receive an email stating the payment failed and you must pay via bank transfer. The fraudsters reassure you by using the widely recognised Trusted Shop Trustmark, but they are using the Trustmark fraudulently and have not been certified by Trusted Shops and therefore the purchaser is not covered by the Trusted Shop money-back guarantee.

**Protect Your Money:**

- Check the authenticity of the websites before making any purchases. Conduct a 'who is' search on the website which will identify when the website was created, be wary of newly formed domains. You can conduct this search using the following website - <https://who.is/>
- Carry out online research in relation to the website, company name and address to identify any poor feedback or possible irregularities.
- Check the Trusted Shops Facebook page where warnings about websites using their Trustmark are published. If you are in doubt about the legitimacy of a Trustmark then you can contact Trusted Shops on 0203 364 5906 or by email [service@trustedshops.co.uk](mailto:service@trustedshops.co.uk) for confirmation.
- Payments made via bank transfer are not protected if you do not receive the item. Always try to pay by PayPal or credit card which have some payment cover should you not receive your goods.
- If the item advertised seems too good to be true, then it probably is!

For December our Priority was: Anti-social behaviour in Kington. Date set: November 2015. We undertook to: High visibility patrols; Request the community to keep reporting; Deal robustly with youths involved; Prosecute for any offences.

Evening patrols carried out by the safer neighbourhood team with a view to disrupting this behaviour, identifying persons responsible and dealing with the concern accordingly. During November regular high visibility patrols have been conducted in the area of Kington, paying particular attention to the High School, Recreational ground and housing estates. On the 22nd of November two young adults were dealt with for possession of a Class B drug.

To help keep your garden equipment safe and secure, consider fitting a shed alarm or a padlock that emits an alarm noise if tampered with. It was an Lfor Williams Twin Axle galvanised trailer measured 6foot by 4foot. The sides for the trailer were left at the scene.

- 6.5 The grant application was submitted for assessment at the end of December. War Memorials Trust say they will respond with decision within 10 weeks of assessment date.  
Following submission of Faculty paperwork, correspondence received from London Diocesan Office about problems with PC applying instead of PCC – even though this was all checked out with Hereford before submission! Finally decided that the PC can apply but must have Minute from PCC meeting that PCC supports application by PC and email from PCC's insurers that they are happy.
