Date set:	January 2016
We undertook :	<p>*High visibility patrols *Request the community to keep reporting *Deal robustly with youths involved *Prosecute for any offences.</p> <p>Evening patrols carried out by the safer neighbourhood team with a view to disrupting this behaviour, identifying persons responsible and dealing with the concern accordingly.</p> <p>During November regular high visibility patrols have been conducted in the area of Kington, paying particular attention to the High School, Recreational ground and housing estates.</p> <p>Two young adults were dealt with for possession of a Class B drug. 4<sup>th</sup> of March 2016 – evening patrol, youths seen and engaged with, no offences found. 1<sup>st</sup> of March 2016 visible foot patrol at the recreation ground and Lady Hawkins high school, all in order. 27<sup>th</sup> of February 2016 visible foot patrol, six youths spoken to and no offences had been committed. 26<sup>th</sup> of February 2016 visible foot patrol at the recreation ground and Lady Hawkins high school. 21<sup>st</sup> of February 2016 visible foot patrol. 16<sup>th</sup> of February 2016 visible patrol at the recreation ground – no youths. 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of February 2016 – Visible foot patrol. 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2016 and the 29<sup>th</sup> of January 2016 visible patrol carried out at the recreational ground and High school. Foot patrol of the area, no youths and no problems. 23<sup>rd</sup> of January 2016 passing attention at the Cricket Pavilion due to a number of youths gathering, details taken.</p>

NEWS/APPEALS (Please note that the below is not every incident/crime reported for Kington Safer Neighbourhood Team)

Pembridge: Ois Incident: 408S 160216

Two incidents to note in Pembridge, one burglary dwelling and one attempt.

Between Monday the 8<sup>th</sup> of February 2016 and Thursday the 18<sup>th</sup> of February 2016 offender(s) have attended a detached bungalow situated in a quiet cul-de-sac on the edge of the village of Pembridge.

Offender(s) have approached the front of the bungalow gone through a side gate which leads to the back garden, they have then tried to prise open a double glazed window to the rear bedroom but failed to gain entry. Offender(s) have then approached a kitchen window where once again they have tried to prise it open but failed but in so doing they have cracked the inner pane of glass.

No entry was gained to the bungalow.

Ois reference: 612S 170216

The property is a bungalow situated in a residential street within the rural village of Pembridge.

Between Sunday the 14<sup>th</sup> of February and Wednesday the 17<sup>th</sup> of February, the victims discovered the rear door leading from back garden into the kitchen area had been forced causing damage to both the door and frame. Offenders have gained access into the property and stolen various items of jewellery.

Kington: Ois reference: 0366S 070316

The attacked property is a detached building that is utilised as office space in Market Hall Street.

The last time one of the rooms was used was Friday the 7<sup>th</sup> of March between 14:00 hours and 17:00 hours.

Offender(s) have smashed a window to the rear of the property by means unknown and then opened the sash window and entered and searched within.

Unknown at this time if anything has been removed.

Kinnersley: Ois reference: 0299S 240216

Between the 23<sup>rd</sup> of February and the 24<sup>th</sup> of February person unknown have attended a field in Kinnersley and approached and subsequently stole the victim's animal trailer. The trailer is described as a two wheel single decker with a detachable roof.

The trailer has a dented wheel arch on the left side and was displaying registration plate: DV54 CUW. Enquiries currently ongoing.

- 6.1 Lengthsman work in January and February – 90611, C1072, C1073, 90612, 90614, 90604 – clearing gullies, grips and maintenance  
C1073 – removal of storm debris  
90602 – removal of flytipped debris x3  
Check round following heavy rain – cleared gullies and grips
- 6.3 Road and drainage defects reported to BB –  
90611: GR267487 Major ponding. Reinstate connection from gully to stream or re-profile road to fall to stream.  
90612: Outside 'Fairhaven' (GR 263498). Water seeping through verge – possible water main leak.  
90614: 50m West of Pentre Jack Farm. Empty gully chambers and jet pipes (full of silt). Repair road south of Perryn (getting to be impassable once gain).
- 6.4 Neighbourhood Development Plan – Waiting for documents from Herefordshire so that date can be set for Regulation 14 consultation.
- 6.5 Waiting for next meeting of PCC in April to get minute of support. Unable to take process forward until this is received.
- 6.6 Cost of proper aluminium notice to be put up at flytipping hotspot is £70 +VAT, would need a post cemented in.
- 6.7 Noel Kingsbury from Montpelier Cottage has volunteered to be Tree Warden.
- 6.11 Roger Withnell is willing undertake work free-of-charge to update and rebuild a new website that is more in keeping with current needs. Clerk would be able to upload direct and set up pages that are needed to comply with legal requirements.
